The area of Longview Drive and Glendale Road continues to be the place where many teenagers want to be on Halloween, in part because they are sure their friends will be there too. Because of that area's popularity as a place to gather and party, we wish to remind Halloween revelers to be respectful of homeowners and private property and to avoid behavior that could pose a risk or threat to any person. We also wish to remind older kids to be conscious of younger children and their parents who are out to trick-or-treat in the early part of the evening and for whom this is a much looked forward to event.

ECC will again ask the Greenburgh police to make a serious effort to curb rowdy behavior, to prevent property damage and to ensure safety. The police will be patrolling the community and will enforce the law. ECC encourages residents to report any mischief to the police and to let us know the outcome.
